A Mother's Day Reflection

Blueberry Pie Day? Talk Like Shakespeare Day? Help a Horse Day? It seems like we enjoy celebrating special days whenever possible, but Mother's Day is in a class of its own.

Ann Jarvis, who is often credited with beginning Mother's Day in our nation, encouraged her followers to care for the wounded from the Civil War - on both sides. She supported a day when mothers would work to heal the divisions between North and South.

In the 1870's, Julia Ward Howe saw Mother's Day as an opportunity to advocate peace: "Why do not the mothers of mankind interfere in these matters (wars) to prevent the waste of that human life of which they alone bear and know the cost?"

As a child, Anna Jarvis, daughter of Ann, listened to her mother teaching Sunday School and remembered her hope that someone would found a "memorial Mother's Day". She began a campaign that ultimately resulted in a special day to honor mothers that was celebrated across the country.

Peacemakers Day could certainly be a sub-title for Mother's Day. We know that mothers strive to bring peace to their homes, to solve problems without violence, to encourage peace among their children. They try to raise children to be kind, caring, and respectful of others. Those who take on the challenge of "mothering" the children of others do the same.

At our office we see women who have been truly blessed to bring a human life into the world. Some of these women, however, are struggling. Celebrating Mother's Day presents an opportunity to affirm the value of their efforts and strengthen them to persevere.

We at Birthright have a place in our hearts for the second Sunday in May.
